### Duties include (but are not limited to):

- Identify and develop intervention strategies.
- Treat clients to communicate effectively by expressing thoughts using acceptable standards of practice.
- Observe, record, and report client's response to treatment and changes in the client's condition.
- Instruct clients in techniques for more effective communication, including sign language, lip reading and voice improvement.
- Educate clients and family members about various topics such as communication techniques and strategies to cope with or to avoid personal misunderstandings.
- Provide services within the scope of practice as defined by the state laws governing the practice of speech therapy.
- Individual and group therapy within educational and clinic settings.
- Assessments and report writing.
- Work with infants and toddlers, pre-school, elementary, middle school, and high school populations.
- Work with disadvantaged families.
- Maintain appropriate HIPPA compliance
